Compelling setting & characters	Infrequent use of adjectives/adverbs
Clear plot direction	Consistent point of view & verb tense
STEP 3: Copyeditor	STEP 4: Proofreader
Spell check	No typos
Correct grammar & punctuation	Acceptable formatting
Consistent use of names/times/etc.	"Second set of eyes"
